

Annual meetings

Two parish meetings with very similar names took place consecutively on 24th May. The Annual Parish Meeting was a meeting for all electors, at which the PC Chairman, David Francis presented a report of the past year. He welcomed the significant progress and growth in voluntary work undertaken by the wider community through, for example, Vyner Park, the two village halls, SNAC (the climate change group), the emerging Neighbourhood Plan, and the litter-pick. The Parish Council had made effective use of the newly-adopted Northumberland Local Plan in making the case for or against planning proposals. As anticipated, the accounts yielded a surplus / underspend, of £2.3k, which justified the reduction in our Council Tax precept for this new year. The meeting also welcomed Ken Walters' kind offer to re-paint the names on the sponsored bricks which make up the planter in Swarland Square.

This meeting was followed by the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council, at which the various annual appointments were made, and the accounts were signed-off as part of the annual audit process.

The Parish Council (PC) is updating and improving its website, and the new site will be going live in early June. As well as providing details of PC meetings and policies etc., the site will have a number of new features. These will include a Directory of community venues and clubs, and an Events calendar. Your support for the work that they will be doing and the Neighbourhood Plan that they will prepare will be of paramount importance to the future of our local area.



Lower Coquetdale Red Squirrels

We have sad news to report about Swarland Wood Red Squirrels recently there has been one dead and one ill Red Squirrel. The dead one was sent away for a post mortem, which showed the possibility of squirrel pox; a full report is pending. Taken together with the presence of the ill Red this is indeed bad news for the small population in Swarland Wood. Squirrel pox is carried by Grey Squirrels, which are unaffected by it, and passed on to Red Squirrels, where it is always fatal.

All feeders etc have been removed from the Wood because of the risk of cross-contamination between species. We will allow 6-8 weeks to pass before re-starting our monitoring which always includes spraying and cleaning our feeders with a veterinary disinfectant.

Once again, we are grateful to the dog walker who reported the dead squirrel in the first place and to the horse riders who reported the ill one.

We will be attending the meeting with Forestry England, to be held shortly in the Swarland Village Hall, in order to find out and clarify its plans for Red Squirrels and their habitat during the clear-felling and thinning of the wood which is due to take place later this year.
