

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Neighbourhood Watch Update - July 2023

Swarland / Newton on the Moor:

Once again, I am happy to report that up to 20th July I have received no information from the police regarding any criminal activity in our two areas.

You may however be interested in the following information - at the beginning of July the police launched Operation Impact, when over 500 police officers and volunteers were involved in activity across all six local authority areas. Over £100,000-worth of drugs were seized from addresses including South Shields, Ashington and Elswick. Over 50 arrests were made for drug supplying, assault and burglary.

Operation Impact will continue over the next 12 months.

Lower Coquetdale Red Squirrels - July 2023

We have had a few sightings (in real life and on camera) of Red Squirrels in Swarland Wood following the recent outbreak of Squirrel Pox. This is obviously very encouraging.

We have thought recently about trying to encourage a "garden trapping" scheme locally. This works well in other villages, and our group has had great success locally in Eshott, once a haven for Red Squirrels but now taken over by Greys.

If householders who have regular sightings of Grey Squirrels in their garden want to be involved, we will provide a trap and advice about where to site it in the garden. If a Grey Squirrel is trapped, the householder will have the phone numbers of several of our members who can be contacted, who will come and remove the squirrel for you. We hope that by using this involvement of the village we will be able to discourage the spread of grey squirrels and thereby encourage the survival of the reds.

NotM & Swarland Parish Council - July 2023

Website

School

We are still receiving queries and hearing anxieties about the future of Swarland School, due to some false rumours coming from a neighbouring village. As a result, we have checked yet again with the County Council and we have been assured that there are no plans for, nor any prospect of, Swarland School being closed.

Further, there is no substance to the claim that the building has a limited life of only 15 years. Periodically, the Government commissions a nationwide survey of the condition of all local authority school buildings and their grounds, covering: structural; roofs; building fabric; windows and doors; mechanical and electrical; asbestos; utilities; sewage and drainage; fire safety and security; and site layout. The 2018 survey categorised the conditions as A (good) and B (satisfactory), with just the windows needing to be upgraded to double glazing (which have now been upgraded). The 2022 survey again categorised the school as A and B, with just the LED lighting upgrade project requiring completion.

So, the building is sound, the grounds are a marvellous resource, and the education is excellent, and we are pleased that our local school has a solid future.

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Alnwick Foodbank

Our recent move to new premises has been successful! We are now in a unit in The Lindisfarne Centre on Lindisfarne Road, a newly refurbished council building, along with Citizens Advice Bureau and other community organisations. There's also an excellent cafe in the building, open 9-3 weekdays, open to anyone.

In an effort to stop using plastic packing bags and give people some dignity of choice, we no longer hand out pre-packed parcels. Our clients, who have all been referred from CAB, Job Centre, or another designated agency, now choose their own items from a set list. Most of the food we provide is non-perishable, but we also give fresh meat and fruit / veg, eggs, butter and cheese. We buy most of the perishables from small local suppliers. We are grateful that financial donations from the public allow us to continue to buy these staple products, topped up with donations from shoppers in our local supermarkets. In these harsh economic times, our clients are very appreciative of the small quantities we are able to give out.

We appeal to you to please keep donating non-perishables in one of the supermarket donation boxes (Sainsburys, Morrisons, Lidl, or Nisa). Pets at Home has a donation box for us for dog/cat food. We would also love any extra produce from your gardens or allotments! Harrison Leisure Planning Application – an Update

In May 2023, Harrison Leisure submitted a Reserved Matters application for the Bari Bar site on Coast View (23/01695/REM). This is for 14 dwellings based on the approved outline application (19/04108/OUT) granted in January 2021.

The Planning Officer, James Hudson, was contacted as clarification was needed as to the exact ownership of the dwellings – it was not clear whether they would be permanent residential homes or holiday homes. The majority of the submitted objections to this application referred to the same lack of clarity of ownership.

The closing date for public comments was the 4^{th} July -28 were received, none of which supported the application. Furthermore, Highways Development Management, the Local Lead Flood Authority and the NCC Ecologist have also expressed objections to various aspects of the application.

Harrison Leisure has now submitted amended plans and other information to the planning portal (as of the 25th July) but no amended or updated S106 agreement (submitted for the outline application).
