

Review of 2021 Census **(Updated from previous version with up to date Census Information 24th** **October 2023)**

1) Comparison with the 2011 Census:

Population:

The population 905 in 2011 has increased to 960 in 2021.

An increase of only 55 people in 10 years. (42 additional homes built 2016 to 2021)

The statistics would indicate the increase is mainly due to new housing as opposed to natural population growth as the number of children has reduced over the time period.

Age:

Again different categories, but using the 2011 Census categories against as close as possible from Census 2021:

Aged 0-15: 10.2% in 2011 reduced to 9.9% aged 0-14 in 2021

Aged 16-64: 65% in 2011 reduced to 51.1% aged 15-64 in 2021

Aged 65+: 24.8% in 2011 increased to 39% aged 65+ in 2021

The largest decrease was in the 25-64 age group, reducing from 56.8% in 2011 to 45.8% in 2021

The largest increase was in the 65-74 age group, increasing from 16% in 2011 to 25% in 2021

(Figures subject to rounding)

Households:

An increase from 410 in 2011 to 440 in 2021.

An additional 30 households.

Household type:

Is now renamed Accommodation type on the 2021 Census with far fewer categories, but with similar results.

There is now 96.6% whole house or bungalow, 0.9% flat, maisonette or apartment and 2.5% caravan/ mobile structure.

The 2011 equivalent would be 95.6% whole house or bungalow, 2.5% flat etc and 2% caravan etc.

Tenure:

The 2021 Census shows 10.4% more owned outright than 2011, 8.8% less mortgages etc than 2011 and 1.7% fewer rented etc. than 2011.

Brief Summary of other information from Census 2021:

- The Parish mainly identifies as being White (98.3%) and either Christian 60.7% or no religion/ not answered 38.3%.
- Mainly older adults aged over 65, Married and living as couples in 2 person households with 4 or more bedrooms.
- Mainly economically inactive with homes owned outright and 2 or more cars.

- Qualified to a higher level than the England average.
- Of those working, many do so from home – 42.1%
- Second homes, the Census from 2021 shows 97% of the Parish as having no second address
- No non-English speaking Residents (so no translations required)
- Other areas of the Census not covered in my information document are similar to England as a whole figures and with low impact on overall demographics.
