

Neighbourhood Watch Update – September 2023

Swarland / Newton on the Moor:

Once again, I am happy to report that up to 21st September 2023, I have had no information from the police, regarding any criminal activity in our two areas. This is not due to luck. I know from speaking to residents that we are very much aware of the need to be vigilant, especially with maintaining the security of our properties. CAN YOU HELP?

Officers are investigating a serious collision in our county. At 12.30pm on Monday 18th September, police received a report of a multi-vehicle road traffic collision on the A1 southbound near Stannington. It was reported that an HGV was travelling on the A1 when, for reasons still to be established, it collided with four other vehicles. Eight people were taken to hospital.

A 43-year-old man has been arrested on suspicion of causing serious injury by dangerous driving. Two people are still in hospital with serious injuries.

The police are determined to fully understand what actually happened. They urge that any key witnesses come forward, particularly those driving on the A1, north or southbound, at the time of this collision. They are particularly interested if anyone has a dashcam or CCTV footage.

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NotM & Swarland Parish Council - September 2023

Finance

We have started to review our current budget, with a view to setting next year's budget and precept, probably at our November meeting. We do not anticipate any significant changes. However, as ever, we would appreciate early notice from local groups in our area of any projects or other ideas that might usefully benefit from our financial support.

Loss of a service

We were sad to hear, at short notice, that the newspaper, eggs and milk sales at Swarland Club would be ceasing. Following the closure in The Square of our only Shop and Post Office some years ago, the community benefitted enormously from John Richardson and others at the Club who stepped forward to keep this service going. It has been a key part of the community's social fabric, and 'collecting the papers' has been part of the daily exercise regime for many local residents. We thank John, and wish him well in his 'retirement'.

Casual vacancy

After several years of valuable service, Carolyn Letts has stepped down from the Parish Council. She has been our main link with the School, Forestry England and Percy Wood, as well as being an active contributor to various climate change initiatives, as a member of SNAC. We are pleased that she will be continuing to serve the community, via both SNAC and the school governors.

Although it is not yet certain, we assume that we will be able to fill the vacancy by co-opting a volunteer, rather than undergoing a formal byelection. We therefore invite anyone who is interested to write to us (up to 500 words) outlining why they would like to be considered. Currently, we are under-represented by: females; the area in and around Swarland, and the under-60s.

New bus services

We still have no firm date for the introduction of the long-promised, oncea-week bus services to Alnwick and to Morpeth. We understand that the tendering exercise was conducted several months ago and completed in August. Since then, NCC staff have been engaged in other pressing priorities, which we can understand. However, our new services are over 9 months behind their original estimated starting date. We have taken this matter up with the County Council.

Guyzance Crossroads

Following the latest serious accident at this junction, we contacted National Highways to repeat our request for improvements to its safety. Here is an extract from their response:

(Cont)

"We keep the safety performance of our network under continuous review. Accordingly, we are aware of the collision at Guyzance Crossroads which occurred on Wednesday 2nd August. You will appreciate that it would be inappropriate for us to pass comment on the collision so soon after the incident. However, we will review the findings of the collision investigation and take them into consideration as we continue to develop safety interventions for this section of the A1.

Following the previous engagement with the Parish Council, we secured Preliminary Design funding to progress a safety scheme for Guyzance Crossroads. In our previous response we outlined some of the options which have been discounted. Our preferred option is to install a nearside diverge lane for southbound A1 vehicles and to bring the southbound offside diverge facility up to current standard. We also intend to make improvements to the signing and road marking layout, to increase warning of the risk of vehicular conflicts as well as improving driver information regarding authorised movements.

We are now working to identify funding to deliver our scheme. However, we are currently experiencing funding constraints and so it is possible that our proposed scheme will not progress beyond Preliminary Design until the third Road Investment Strategy (RIS3) which begins in March 2025."

High fences

Local residents have been voicing concerns about the small, but growing, number of high fences that are being erected on frontages abutting the highway, which are generally out of character with the softer appearance of hedges, which are a treasured part of many of our streets. With few exceptions, the erection on the front of a property of any fence higher than 1 metre will normally require planning permission.

Many thanks to all of you who came along to see us at the Swarland Show. It was a great event and we were delighted to get the opportunity to chat to everyone who came and said hello.

Bus Service

You might be wondering what's happening with the bus service....as you may remember NCC received funding for a number of new services, including ours, in March this year. A tender was issued during the summer and although responses were received in August, NCC have not yet evaluated them due to the pressure of other work. We've continuing to put pressure on them to make a decision so that the service can finally begin.....

Storm Arwen Recovery Work

We've recently heard from Forestry England that the work in Swarland Wood is likely to start at the end of October. On 26th September children from Swarland Primary school walked down to the site with Alex MacLennan and Michael Osborne from Forestry England who told them about the plans. The children will get an opportunity to see the machinery later and will be involved in re-planting. After felling, the ground will require a fallow period to make sure it is free of pests when planting begins, so planting is likely to commence early in 2025. Any trees that self-seed in that period will be kept. It should be very interesting to see what else comes up!

Ranting about Rivers

There's been a lot in the news recently about the state of UK rivers, so we are particularly pleased to be welcoming Steve Lowe from the Northumberland Rivers Trust to our next meeting at **7pm on Tuesday 17th October at Swarland Village Hall.** The title of Steve's talk is **'Ranting about Rivers'** and he'll be talking about the state of local rivers such as the Coquet. Everyone is welcome to come along.

8th October - Arthur Scott celebrates 100 years!

"Seeing Arthur Scott celebrate his 100th birthday, and being able to share his many forestry stories, is to me inspirational, and really sits with the Forestry England vision to *think beyond a lifetime*" says Alex MacLennan of Forestry England. Arthur started work with the then Forestry Commission in October 1941, giving 47 years to "planting, fencing, ditching, weeding and vermin control [much of it in Swarland Wood], as well as planting trees on the A1 from Newcastle to the Scottish border" adds his daughter Jan. Alex goes on to say:

"Arthur gives a wonderful insight into the work of the Forestry Commission over the decades, and how the forests of Northumberland have become real treasures for society. The FC, now Forestry England, has been built since its formation in 1919 on the back of dedicated individuals such as Arthur, who have seen their work as a vocation rather than simply a job.

The work of forestry staff in Arthur's era was simply outstanding, and today's generation walks amongst forests created by many Arthurs across the county. You have to remember that back in Arthur's day, their work involved being left on hillsides all day long to establish the forests, with very little welfare provision compared to today's standards.

Arthur has an amazing memory, and his knowledge of the local woods, and of course his Swarland Wood, is legendary. Everyone at Forestry England is thrilled to hear that Arthur is celebrating his 100th birthday!"

Arthur has lived in the forestry cottage at the entrance to Swarland Wood since 1953, where he still looks after his hens and extensive garden, feeds the Red Squirrels and dispatches the Greys. He's familiar to so many of us in the village, and we all wish him well as we look forward to his birthday celebration in Swarland Village Hall on Saturday 7th October, organised by his family including daughter and son-in-law Sue and John Richardson, who are also familiar figures in the community.

We are very pleased to say that because all Steering Group members are making a good contribution to the process, we are moving forward more quickly than the original project plan indicated that we might.
